## PROGRAM NOTE

Get ready for an exciting adventure! You are about to embark on an epic fantasy through an ancient mountain pass. Let the music be your guide as you find your way up and over this enchanted, snowcapped mountain full of new sights and sounds. We will all reach the summit together as we perform *Mountain Rangers* by Brian Bankston.

## NOTES TO CONDUCTOR

Please adhere strictly to the marked tempo. Use a metronome to keep the meter as consistent as possible.

Begin by pointing out the combined articulations used in the introduction (meas. 1-17). Teach them the difference between accented staccato and accented tenuto. Pay attention to the bells and triangle part (meas. 1-12) in order to create a sense of forward momentum.

Notice how separate musical lines have contrasting articulations. This will help each line speak independently. Balance each section to the best of your band's ability.

In measures 33-34, ask the musicians to attack the note clearly as each new idea is introduced in order to create the desired layering effect.

Measures 37-42 present a melodic idea that filters up 3 octaves through the band. Measures 67-69 present an ascending scale that filters through the sections. Be sure to balance the melody with the supporting parts in each of these sections.

Make sure the bass players play the last note of this piece with a full resonate sound and be sure they do not clip it too short.

While rehearsing this piece, encourage your students to breath at the ends of phrases and to use plenty of air support while sustaining their tone. Remind them to relax and to maintain control of their instruments. Finally, remind them that music should be fun and exciting!

Best of luck! I hope you and your young musicians enjoy rehearsing and performing *Mountain Rangers* for your next concert, honor band or festival.
